NAPLES - An exhibit, a seminar on the fight against organized crime in the Mediterranean and a room at the Museum of Peace - the Mediterranean Foundation in Naples is celebrating its 30th anniversary with a series of events that involve Italian and Mediterranean authorities to promote dialogue and engagement on open issues in the area.

Celebrations will start on May 3 at the Museum of peace MAMT with a ceremony of the 2018 Mediterranean awards to be given to Mana Saeed Al-Otaiba, prince of the United Arab Emirates and among the most important Arab poets; Mustapha Bakkouri, president of the region of Casablanca and the Moroccan energy agency; Khalid Bin Khalifa Al Khalifa, director of world Islamic center ISA, in Bahrain; Dario Franceschini, culture minister; Italian sociologist Domenico De Masi; Roberto Reggi, director of the Italian state property agency; architect Massimo Pica Ciamarra.

The room Al-Otaiba for poetry and dialogue among civilizations of the museum for - MAMT will be inaugurated for the occasion. Its collection includes books, reviews and multimedia support on the main Arab poets as well as from other countries.

The following day the maritime station of Naples will host international guests including Moroccan Minister Mohamed Kabbaj who will pay homage to the "Totem of peace" with the remains of the unknown soldier.

Afterwards an international round table will be held on 'urban civilization: precondition for legality' with an introduction to an exhibit on the theme to open on May 11.

Crime will be discussed on May 5 with a Summit of the Mediterranean on the fight against the mafia in Italy and the Mediterranean coordinated by Salvatore Calleri, president of the Fondazione Caponnetto.
