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The Bologna Charter Initiative

The Charter of the **Regions and local Administrations** for the promotion of a **common framework** for **strategic actions** aimed at the **protection** and **sustainable development** of the Mediterranean **coastal areas**.

A joint initiative, started by EU Regions but open to other coastal Administrations of the Southern & Eastern Mediterranean, performing concrete objectives even structural ones, able to attain diversified funding resources with a high capacity of mainstreaming.









Updating of the BC' Joint Action Plan

The JAP was elaborated in 2014 finalized and presented in March 2015, within the MED Capitalization Final Event in Brussels (by CoR premises);

Updating ongoing in 2017 is taking into account new policies and initiatives at the Med scale concerning maritime and coastal issues, i.e.:

- the recent EU **WESTMED** [COM(2017) 183 final] and its Framework for Action [SWD(2017) 130 final];
- the BLUEMED Initiative and its Strategic Research and Innovation Agenda;
- the Strategy for Growth and Jobs in Coastal and Maritime Tourism [COM(2014) 86 final];
- the findings of the **UfM Working Groups** on Blue Economy and on Environment and Climate;

Moreover, the JAP updating regards **Action lines state of implementation** and is open to **contributions and further Major Coastal Projects** from new entry Members and the **advancements of the MCPs already included** (Annex 3 and 4 of the JAP) and under development or realized.

Advancements of JAP Major Coastal Projects (ex. 1/3)

Larnaca North Coastal Redevelopment Project (CYPRUS- 01)



First phase realization: the Ministerial Public Works Department started (Nov 2016) the construction of 5 detached breakwaters in combination with nourishment in the area next to storage facilities (2,2 M€) – June 2018

The Department of Town Planning and Housing started the **preliminary plans for the development of the area**, including also the plans for restoration.

The Ministry of Communication and Works is in the process to select the private investor for the development of the Larnaca harbour and marina.


Beach nourishment of sandy coasts in Herault Depart. (**Herault-01**)

Protection du Lido de Maguelone à Frontignan (**Herault-02**)

Contrat de Plan Etat-Région 2015 – 2020 and PLAN LITTORAL 21 funds from FEDER 20%, Fr State 30%, Region Occitanie 15%, Département Herault 15% and local funds / Communes 20%.

Lido de SETE – 4,3 M€ 1400 m wave attenuator 2017-2018

Beach of VIAS – 25 M€ nourish and dunes planned start in 2018

Advancements of JAP Major Coastal Projects (ex. 3/3)

Extraordinary nourishment on Emilia-Romagna coast with off-shore sand (RER-02)



Realized in February - June 2016

20 M€ (18,5 National funds / 1,5 Regional funds)


8 critical coastal stretches

11 km overall of littorals

1,4 Millions of cubic meters of sand

130 cubic meters /per linear meter (average)













Scheme for proposing Major Coastal Projects

Major Coastal Projects proposed to be included in the JAP should be **compliant** with ICZM and MSP principles and should be described as in the following scheme:

- Project title
- Brief description of the typology and main features of the project
- Possible limitations (environment, social, regulatory, etc.)
- Level of design of the project (scheme, preliminary, definitive, etc.)
- Budget amount estimation and possible schedule
- Actors involved and participatory process envisaged
- Map with location and general features of the area

NB Inclusion in the BC-JAP doesn't mean automatically funding, but highlights and common efforts for promoting the Major Coastal Project in all the opportune venues.







Concluding...

- The Bologna Charter Initiative is open to all Mediterranean Countries, Regions and local Administrations that want to join, simple procedure stated in Article 4.3 of the Charter
- The Initiative can be extended operatively throughout the collaboration in projects developing along with its JAP, like the project CO-EVOLVE or its foreseen extension "MEDCoast4BG", and other transnational projects (i.e. MED, ENI CBC, ADRION, ITALY-CROATIA, IPA, etc.)
- The Joint Action Plan is under revision and can be integrated with priorities, actions, major coastal projects of other MED Countries and Regions, the JAP 2nd Revision is ongoing, launched in February 2017 to be completed by December 2017, referents for the revision process are the Emilia-Romagna Region and the Intermediterranean Commission of the CPMR
