



OUR SHIP

The Combat Support Ship 'Cantabria' was built by Navantia in the shipyard of Puerto Real (Cádiz), and it was commissioned Navy in July 2010.

In 2013, was deployed for almost a year integrated in the Royal Australian Navy.

In 2017 'Cantabria' was Operation SOPHIA flagship for 4 months.

It has been recently deployed in NATO Maritime Group n 2. It contributes on a regular basis to NATO Response Force integrated in its maritime groups and participates in several national and international exercises, such as Trident Juncture 2018.

OUR MISSION

Provide logistical support to Naval Forces in combat, in Humanitarian Operations and in environmental protection tasks.

Our modern equipments and systems allow us to be fully integrated in a naval force and to extend our scope of action to the whole world.

Besides providing logistical support, we can contribute to surveillance and security operations, both national and international.

We are able to conduct flight operations with medium and heavy helicopters, during day and night.

There is also a 214 square meters hospital on board. It is fully equipped with intensive care room and operating room.
