ALF Board of Governors:

"Fifteen years after the launching of the Barcelona Process, the notion of dialogue between cultures needs to be enriched and reviewed, and must include a global and dynamic approach, which takes into consideration the **interrelation existing** between intercultural dialogue and human rights, development, environmental factors and peace" (*Strategic Guidelines*, October 2010)

NSDS - 2009-2011

The "Network of Networks" model enhanced through:

- •Involving Networks in the design of the ALF strategies
- •Associating them in the implementation of ALF programmes and activities
- •Reinforcing Network's structure through coordination, mobilization and capacity building
- •Encouraging regional and national initiatives, building upon the Networks' diversity



NSDS - 2009-2011


Results:

- •Network Members involved in ALF programmes (around 43% of members in 2010)
- •Network Services delivered (among which, 165 Network meetings during Steps 3-4)
- •Common Operations organized (75 during Steps 3 4)
- •Membership Reconfirmation: 3,900 (October 2011) 4,011 (October 2010)

NSDS - 2009-2011

Weaknesses:

- Non-competitive HoN service delivery toward member organizations, and scarce Network identity among member organizations
- Limited Network decision-making power and management rotation mechanisms, and fragile acknowledgment by member organizations of the Coordination's leadership
- Partial or insufficient involvement of member organizations in other ALF programmes
- Lengthy administrative process by both HoN and ALF Secretariat in the NSDS management.





2009-2011 LESSONS LEARNT

THE MORE the Network decision-making process and coordination is participatory, &

the **interaction** between ALF Secretariat and Networks is **fruitful**,

THE MORE the performance rate of the Network grows, &

the visibility of the Network in their civil society gains ground

the Network Scheme management is **smoother**.


