# Forging a common destiny across the Mediterranean

Dialogue between cultures, which is the roadmap of the Anna Lindh Foundation, is a long-term strategy to address the true causes - political, ideological and social - that have deepened and radicalised the human gap between the two shores of the Mediterranean.

During the last two decades, the Mediterranean landscape has been characterised by cultural misunderstandings and political conflicts. All of us have been hostages, whether as passive observers or as tragic victims, to those who have set out to take over our cultures and values.

The launching of the Anna Lindh Foundation in 2005 was a historic and collective step to address this 'clash of ignorance' between people living across the Mediterranean. Shared and supported by the 43 countries of the Euro-Mediterranean Partnership, the Foundation was born to bring together the civil society of the region for intercultural dialogue and to work for a common future.

Since my first days as President of the Anna Lindh Foundation, we have made it very clear that the perspective of the Union for the Mediterranean exists as the engine of the Foundation's daily work; a 'ball of twine' to forge and give chance to a common destiny for the societies of the region, beyond identities and beliefs, and based on co-ownership and reciprocity.

In its first years, the Foundation has supported regionwide initiatives and campaigns in fields of education, culture and media, focusing its activities in the spaces where advocating for dialogue is more needed. Involving many thousands of NGOs in its programmes and activities, the Anna Lindh Foundation has become one of the most credible and legitimate institutions working within the Euro-Mediterranean civil society.

In the Southern and Eastern countries of the Mediterranean but also in Europe, this very same civil society has shown a strong resilience not to accept the logic of status quo and cultural divide and is calling for a different future, based in shared democratic values, dignity and mutual respect.

In this way, the work of the Anna Lindh Foundation today, six years on from its launch, is more challenging and more essential than ever. Building on what has been achieved in the first years, the Foundation is now in a position to play a central role in putting an end to the regressive and archaic notion of a clash of civilizations and ushering in a new era of Euro-Mediterranean relations.

## İtaly

The Italian ALF Network launched and partnered in regional cooperation projects financed by the Foundation and focused on cross-cultural dialogue; the Network is coordinated by the Napoli-based Fondazione Mediterraneo in cooperation with 18 regional coordinators.

In December 2005, the ALF organised in Naples, in partnership with the Italian Network Head, the first 'Euro-Med Youth Workshop' with 70 young people. The following year, in 2006, the ALF and Network colaunched the first edition of the Euro-Med Dialogue Award, a region-wide prize to raise the visibility of crosscultural leaders. For 2008's '1001 Actions for Dialogue' campaign, following the initial phase of mobilisation, the ALF received in the opening month of the Initiative over 200 proposed dialogue actions, ranging from theatre events and story-telling workshops in Lecce to dance festivals in Rome; in the framework of '1001 Actions, the ALF also organised in Italy the Euro-Med Youth Forum on Water and Intercultural Dialogue in cooperation with Paralleli Institute and supported the 'Manipulations of Peace' intiative with young artists from Egypt, Israel and Palestine. In 2008, the Network hosted in Naples the Advisory Council meeting.

For ALF's 2009 Initiative, 'Restore Trust, Rebuild Bridges', the Network launched 'The Bridge for Euro-Med Dialogue' which consisted of several Initiatives for peace and cultural diversity. In the framework of the ALF's Journalist Award, Reporting across Cultures, winning Italian journalists have included Annalisa Monfreda of the GEO Italia magazine for her article about the Albanian migrants to Italy, and Ennio Remondino of Rai TV for his reportage about religious ethnicities coexisting in Turkey. In October 2010, the ALF and Italian Network Head co-organised the seminar on non-violence with social activists, educators and former combatants from Euro-Med countries.
